LIFESPAN AND COVID-19

During the COVID-19 outbreak which began March, 2020, LifeSpan's doors have remained open to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our older adult population. We have trained on social distancing and have provided masks and gloves to ensure the safety of our older adults and staff. Our agency has pulled together to assist one another in every possible way.

Our Care Management staff has been working diligently getting new consumers signed up for services including Meals on Wheels (MOW). Prior to March 16, 2020, our Meals on Wheels department was servicing roughly 740 seniors daily, currently, we are up to 825 seniors and that number continues to rise. MOW deliveries would not be possible without the help and support of our volunteers and staff.

Our centers in Carnegie, Imperial and McKeesport remain staffed to receive calls from older adults that may need assistance. Center staff conducts wellness calls to center participants twice weekly to ensure safety. Not only are the Center staff making calls, but also helping to deliver the MOW to recipients near the centers. Older adult safety and wellbeing are our priority; we cherish the acknowledgments and recognition of our efforts.

Our Protective Service staff have completed investigations into allegations of elder abuse both in-person and over the phone.

ifeSpan provided participants with 3,752 visits through the Senior Companion Program between July 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019.





CARE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM - Successes

Care Management (CM) staff assisted a consumer who did not understand
the disease process for diabetes. The consumer had been provided
information from the doctor and other sources, but was not understanding.
The CM staff found a booklet that the consumer understood and the
consumer was happy the staff member found the resource.

- CM staff assisted a consumer with special funding for a large concrete project. This project prevented rainwater from coming in the basement through a damaged patio.
- CM staff assisted a consumer with securing a new food stamp card to replace the one the consumer lost. CM staff verified the balance on the card and the consumer was pleasantly surprised to find she did not lose her accumulated benefits.
- CM staff were able to assist several consumers and their families with placement in facilities when the consumer was no longer able to remain at home independently.

ifeSpan's Care

At that time LifeSpan's Care Management staff included 4 Supervisors, 26 Care Managers, and 2 support staff.

- CM staff assisted numerous consumers with applications for higher-level services, housing resources and resource information specific to their situation.
- CM staff delivered space heaters, fans, water and emergency food throughout the year.

Protective Services

• LifeSpan successfully responded to the Request for Proposal for Protective Services and was awarded a contract that started July 1, 2019.

Caregiver Support Program (CSP)

A multitude of help was offered to CSP Caregivers by LifeSpan's Care Managers including but not limited to:

- Through a one-time grant, LifeSpan was able to provide caregivers with training on the use of mobile devices and provided them with a tablet to assist with their caregiving responsibilities.
- CM staff provided caregivers with resources on dementia, caregiver respite, self-care and assisted with applications to other programs.
- CM staff assisted a caregiver in selecting an elder-care attorney who could assist with improving
 the credit score of the consumer. The consumer wanted to move into a new apartment and the
 individual's credit score was too low.

Meals on Wheels

Meals on Wheels (MOW) is a state and federally funded program that provides healthy meals as well as face-to-face health and safety monitoring checks to 850 eligible adults in Allegheny County. LifeSpan has 4 kitchens to service the South Western part of Allegheny County, Homestead, Clairton, Knoxville and Imperial.

Eligible recipients are adults that are sixty (60) years of age or older, a resident of Allegheny County, and have a need for meals.

A suggested donation is requested from the participant to help pay for the packaging and delivery of the meals to the home.

To start the meals, contact the Area Agency on Aging (ACAAA) Senior Line to determine eligibility and get the meals started, 412-350-5460 or 412-350-4235 for after hours, weekends and holidays. Potential participants should be prepared to complete a short assessment over the phone.

Community Health Choices (Medicaid) or Private Insurance Pay is available for individuals not meeting the ACAAA eligibility criteria.

ifeSpan's Meals on Wheels
Program operates four kitchens and served a total of 164,660 meals to 1,292 individuals between July 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019.

Two meals are delivered on Mondays and Wednesdays and one meal on Fridays, unless more are indicated in an individual's plan.

During COVID-19, LifeSpan's Meals on Wheels Staff continued delivering meals as usual.
