



# **CENTER SERVICES**

 LifeSpan, Inc. currently operates 6 Senior Community Resource Centers throughout Southwestern Allegheny County.

- The Centers are as unique as the individuals who visit them. Centers are open Monday through Friday, but hours vary.
- The Centers are vibrant and alive offering a diverse menu of activities as well as the normal daily schedules.
- Activities include a congregate meal, transportation registration, information and assistance, casino trips, Wii bowling, bridge clubs, book clubs, fitness/wellness instruction and art groups.

LifeSpan Center Services operated 6 Senior Centers and 3 program extensions serving **374 Consumers**, between July 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021.

The Centers served 22,301 Congregate Meals.

23,519 Units of Information and Assistance was provided through the AIRS Certified Specialists.

# **SOCIAL SERVICES**

### **Care Management**

 Those who are 60+ are eligible for OPTIONS. They can have some degree of either physical or mental frailty, or they can experience both. An evaluated individual may qualify for an appropriate form of care, ranging from adult day services and respite to basic home support services.

- All individuals over the age of 60 qualify for care management and identification of resources.
- There is no financial eligibility requirement for OPTIONS based services. However, consumers may be required to make a copayment for services based on income.

**Caregiver Support Program** 

- The Caregiver Support Program (CSP) assists family and friends over the age of 18 in caring for their loved one in their home.
   The focus is to respond to the needs of the caregiver so that they are able to provide the best care possible for their loved one.
- All reimbursement is subject to the household income of the caregiver's loved one.
- A caregiver will receive a percentage of their qualifying purchases based on the income provided.
- There is also an opportunity for an older caregiver relative aged 55 and older to care for grandchildren or other family members who are not their own children under the age of 18.

LifeSpan's Care Management program provided services to

**3,165 Consumers** between 7/1/2020 & 6/30/2021.

At that time the Care Management staff included:

## **MEALS ON WHEELS**

 LifeSpan's MOW/HDM program, is a state and federally funded program that provides healthy meals and wellness checks to over 800 participating Older Adults in Allegheny County.

- In recognition of the multiple needs of the "whole" person. The MOW program is committed to service, provision and coordination within the broad realm of nutrition, health-related, and home care services.
- These meals provide a 1/3 of the Older Adult's daily nutritional needs that are delivered by a dependable MOW delivery driver their home.
- Meals are delivered Monday, Wednesday, and Friday (except on holidays) between the hours of 9 am and 4 pm. You must be at home to receive delivery of your meals. This is to ensure a face-to-face health and safety monitoring check.
- Older Adults looking to sign up for MOW must first call the Allegheny County Area Agency on Aging Senior Line to determine eligibility through completing a short assessment over the phone.

LifeSpan's Meals on Wheels
Program
operates four kitchens and served a total of 216,625 Meals to 1,491 Participants between 7/1/2020 & 6/30/2021.

Two meals are delivered on Monday's and Wednesday's, and one meal on Friday's, unless more are indicated in an individual's plan.



LifeSpan's "Tails of Kindness" Pet Program helps provide a bag of pet food weekly for our MOW participants with furry companions. The pet program has partnered with local PetSmart pet stores for in-kind donations.

The "Tails of Kindness" Pet Program provides 2 Cups of Food – per animal, per week for 53 MOW Participants with Pets. Serving 94 Animals (Cats & Dogs) and 2 Birds with food.

## **PROTECTIVE SERVICES**

 Investigate elder abuse and neglect in the community, facilities, and hospitals.

- Provide assistance to alleviate imminent risk.
- Provide a full evaluation to determine the needs of older adults.
- Retain an older adult's autonomy throughout the process of investigation, if they are determined to be "of sound mind".
- Coordinate services with other entities to assist in the long term care of seniors.
- Investigators assisted older adults with resources for food, clothing, shelter, in-home services, mental health services, relocation, emergency medical care and other essential resources.
- Investigators collaborated with community organizations, law enforcement and ambulance services to ensure safety of older adults.

LifeSpan's Protective Service Investigators initiated 1,180 Reports of elder abuse between 7/1/2020 & 6/30/2021.

At that time the Protective Service staff included:

- 1 Operations Director
- 1 Director
- 2 Supervisors
- 14 Investigators
- 1 Assistant
